Local Connection

Residents and businesses within the city of Mississauga are connected locally through MiWay and the Mississauga transitway – effectively connecting 717,599 residents and over 90,000 businesses.

MiWay Public Transit

- The City of Mississauga is serviced by MiWay It's public transit system.
- MiWay is the third largest municipal transit system in the Province of Ontario with a total of 57 existing routes and a fleet of more than 460 fully accessible buses, including hybrid electric buses.
- 717, 599 Mississauga residents have access to reliable connections across the city.
- MiExpress and MiLocal routes service various business districts including, but not limited to Airport Corporate, Dixie, Sheridan Park, Gateway and Meadowvale.

Mississauga Transitway Public Transit

- Mississauga's new dedicated transit corridor provides eastwest service supporting thousands of riders per day, making it faster for commuters to travel to, from and through Mississauga and across the region.
- The transitway delivers 18 kilometers of dedicated busway beginning at Winston Churchill Boulevard in the west and ending at Renforth Drive in the east.

- The first four stations at Central Parkway, Cawthra, Tomken and Dixie opened in November 2014. Erin Mills Station in west Mississauga opened in September 2015.

Regional Connection

Residents and businesses within the Toronto CMA are connected by the GO Transit and the Provincial highway system – effectively allowing for activity across the region.

Go Transit

- GO Transit is the regional public transit service for the Greater Toronto and Hamilton Area operated by Metrolinx.
- Go Transit serves a population of more than 7 million across more than 11,000 square kms stretching from the City of Hamilton and Kitchener-Waterloo in the west to Newcastle and Peterborough in the east, and from Orangeville and Beaverton in the north to Niagara Falls in the south.
- GO Transit operates three train lines and several GO Bus routes through Mississauga providing frequent service throughout the day.
- Each of the three lines connects directly to downtown Toronto and other regional hubs.
- The City of Mississauga generates the second most GO Train ridership of any municipality, with 21,000 passengers per day.
- Square One (located in downtown Mississauga) is GO Transit's second busiest terminal after Union Station.
- Metrolinx is currently building the Hurontario LRT which when complete with provide 18 kms of rapid transit between the City of Brampton and the City of Mississauga. It will feature 19 stops and extend the length of the City of Mississauga.

Intermodal

- CN and CPRail provide intermodal services from terminals in Brampton, just north of Mississauga, (CN); Etobicoke, just east of Mississauga, (CP); and Vaughan, northeast of Mississauga, (CP).
- Clients may deal directly with the rail companies to pick up a container or a conventional truck load for shipment by rail and delivery by local delivery truck or transport at the receiving end.
- Due to flexibility, intermodal is rapidly growing as a regular rail service in direct competition to highway trucking.

- In Milton, our neighbours to the north-west, CPR Expressway puts truck trailers on specially designed platform railcars.
- Unique railcars and the expressway business systems were designed in conjunction with the trucking industry and private fleet owners.

Passenger

- Intercity and long distance rail passenger service is provided by VIA Rail Canada and AMTRAK.
- The main passenger rail station is Union Station, located in downtown Toronto, 18 km(11 miles) east of Mississauga.
- Commuter service is provided throughout the Greater Toronto Area on all rail lines by GOTransit (see Public Transit section).

Regional Connection

The City of Mississauga is the only city in the Greater Toronto Area (GTA) serviced by seven major highways, Mississauga offers fast, convenient access to the regional market of 5.6 million and additional access to major destinations in Canada and the USA.

Highway

- Highway 401 (often called "Ontario's Main Street") is by far
 the busiest highway in Canada and North America. It is a
 multi lane complex system of express lanes, collector lanes
 and ramps running from Windsoron the west to the Quebec
 border on the east. Highway 401 passes through Mississauga
 with six interchanges within the City.
- Highway 403 is a multiple lane highway which connects the QEW with Highway 401 and provides an east/west highway link through the centre of Mississauga. There is a convenient interchange at Hurontario St. (Highway 10) with access to the Mississauga City Centre: a major concentration of mixed uses including office, residential, retail and entertainment. Carpool lanes (HOV - High Occupancy Vehicle lanes) are operational on Hwy. 403 allowing vehicles carrying more than one passenger to cut travel times.
- Highway 409 provides a direct link from Highways 401 and 427 to Toronto Pearson International Airport.
- Highway 407 is the world's first all-electronic toll road; a 108 km east-west highway which travels across the northern and western boundaries of Mississauga. This new multi-lane highway spans the northern section of the Greater Toronto Area from Highway 403 in Burlington to Highway 7 in Oshawa.

- Highway 410 provides a link northwards from Highways 403 and 401 through the City of Mississauga to the City of Brampton. It services a major portion of Mississauga's industrial area west of Pearson International Airport.
- **Highway 427** is a north/south highway system linking the City of Toronto with Mississauga and areas to the north.
- The Queen Elizabeth Way(QEW), is a highway that connects the GTAwith the international border at Niagara.
 The QEW provides entry to the USA at Lewiston, Niagara Falls and Buffalo and passes through Mississauga en route to downtown Toronto.

Global Connection

Residents and businesses operating in the City of Mississauga have access to global markets thought its ports and airport.

Port Information

- Mississauga is between two of the largest ports on the Great Lakes: the Port of Toronto and the Port of Hamilton, both on Lake Ontario which have direct access to all lake ports as well as to the Atlantic Ocean via the St. Lawrence Seaway.
- The navigation season on Lake Ontario is based on the opening and closing of the St. Lawrence Seaway and generally runs from April 1 to mid-December.

Go Transit Toronto Pearson International Airport

- Canada's largest airport and North America's 2nd busiest airport, for international passengers, Toronto Pearson International, handling more than 50 million passengers annually prior to the pandemic –, is located right here in Mississauga.
- Ranks as the 30th busiest airport in the world in terms of passenger traffic. (Operates 24/7 365 days a year).
- Service to more than 210 destinations, including 32 Canadian destinations, 37 US cities, and 86 international destinations.
- Largest 2 hour flight catchment area in North America with access to 150 million people (larger than New York City, Chicago and Los Angeles).
- Over 70% of the world's economy is accessible through a plane flight.
- Pearson partners with then 60 airline partners. And more than 1,000 vendors.
- Nearly 87,000 arrival aircrafts movements. (80,000 are passengers and 7,000) from a total of 173,000 aircraft movements.
- Business operations cover 4,600 acres
- 5 runways are equip to handle heavyweight aircraft and is a leading air cargo gateway in Canada, offering world class facilities and infrastructure for all cargo operators.
- Second largest employment zone in Canada.

Customs Clearance

- Toronto Pearson International Airport in Mississauga is the customs port of entry for air freight shipments.
- Interport, a customs warehouse located on Dixie Rd. south of Highway 401, is Mississauga's custom clearance office.
- Rail shipments destined for Mississauga from outside the country are cleared at Pearson.
- Ocean freight is cleared at Pearson International, Port of Hamilton or Brampton, our neighbouring community to the north.

Customs Brokers & Freight Forwarders

- Close to 300 companies are in the freight forwarding and customs brokering business.
- The customs brokers will prepare the necessary import or export documents they receive from the freight forwarder, correctly classify the goods and pay the duty, and forward the shipments as directed.

Trucking Transit

- Within one day's drive of Mississauga are cities that include Chicago, New York, Boston, Washington, D.C. and Montreal; within two day's drive are Minneapolis, St. Louis, Nashville and Atlanta.
- Direct access to North America's market of more than 400 million consumers.
- 141 million consumers live within a 500 mile radius (one day's drive or 1 hour flight) of the Greater Toronto Area.
- Close to 200 Mississauga companies in the truck transportation business have established facilities here because of the strategic location relative to Ontario's major highways.




Transportation Connections Map
